

2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.

The whole educational system from elementary to tertiary level has been collapsed during the lockdown period imposed due to novel corona virus disease 2019 (COVID-19) not only in India but across the globe. Balaji Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences adopted teaching-learning process for subsequent semester examinations. This process gave us an intellectually enriched opportunity for further future academic decision-making during any adversity.

Balaji Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences during the phase of COVID-19, shared vision of education system during the pandemic period, teachers and students are motivated to adapt online teaching-learning platforms in fulfilling the current educational needs. Everyone either teachers or students, were friendly skilled in using social media app viz. WhatsApp, Facebook, which turned into smooth facilitation of using online educational platforms such as ZOOM, Cleco WebEx, Google Meet etc. as a sign of positive transfer of learning. By motivating students, along with collaborating and team teaching was the critical strategies found in creating an online classroom.

Teachers at Balaji Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences developed their action plans for online teaching that were a little bit different from teacher to teacher. Most of the teachers started with preparing study e-materials as per the syllabus, taking online classes as per time table, after taking online classes, study materials being uploaded by them. Few teachers have recorded their video lectures and uploaded to WhatsApp group and on LMS portal for those who missed the classes due to some unavoidable circumstances, as well as providing equal opportunity to access learning. Teachers prepared modules on each unit, what they need to teach. After uploading of that module, they took online classes which enhanced the ability in clearing student doubts. Faculty member gained in these words: "clear and proper planning of the sessions in consultation with the students, lesson preparation, regularity in the conduct of classes, doubt clearing sessions, and personalized responses to the queries of the students is my action plan for online teaching."

Perception on online teaching-learning by principal and head as far as students' they opined that online learning process during the time of COVID-19 had helped them in touch with their lessons outside the four walls of the classroom that has been prohibited the gathering of crowds in the classroom and created an alternative for completion of the syllabus.

- Teaching-learning Experience.
- The overall experience on Teaching-learning shared by Teachers and students include the following:
- During this time of crisis, the online teaching and learning experience enabled much flexibility in issues of time and place for both teachers as well as students.
 - Both teachers and students got opportunity to explore new and innovative online resources.
 - Online classroom platforms were found to be effective in giving assignments and sharing of study materials.
 - For the laboratory courses, students got to learn about some of the advanced instruments via simulations.

2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.

The whole educational system from elementary to tertiary level has been collapsed during the lockdown period imposed due to novel corona virus disease 2019 (COVID-19) not only in India but across the globe. Balaji Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences adopted teaching-learning process for subsequent semester examinations. This process gave us an intellectually enriched opportunity for further future academic decision-making during any adversity. Balaji Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences during the phase of COVID-19, shared vision of education system during the pandemic period, teachers and students are motivated to adapt online teaching-learning platforms in fulfilling the current educational needs. Everyone either teachers or students, were friendly skilled in using social media app viz. WhatsApp, Facebook, which turned into smooth facilitation of using online educational platforms such as ZOOM, Cisco WebEx, Google Meet etc. as a sign of positive transfer of learning. By motivating students, along with collaborating and team teaching was the critical strategies found in creating an online classroom.

Teachers at Balaji Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences developed their action plans for online teaching that were a little bit different from teacher to teacher. Most of the teachers started with preparing study e-materials as per the syllabus, taking online classes as per time table, after taking online classes, study materials being uploaded by them. Few teachers have recorded their video lectures and uploaded to WhatsApp group and on LMS portal for those who missed the classes due to some unavoidable circumstances, as well as providing equal opportunity to access learning. Teachers prepared modules on each unit, what they need to teach. After uploading of that module, they took online classes which enhanced the ability in clearing student doubts. Faculty member opened in these words: "clear and proper planning of the sessions in consultation with the students, lesson preparation, regularity in the conduct of classes, doubt clearing sessions, and personalized responses to the queries of the students is my action plan for online teaching."

Perception on online teaching-learning by principal and head as far as students' they opined that online learning process during the time of COVID-19 had helped them in touch with their lessons outside the four walls of the classroom that has been prohibited the gathering of crowds in the classroom and created an alternative for completion of the syllabus.

- During this time of crisis, the online teaching and learning experience enabled much flexibility in issues of time and place for both teachers as well as students.
 - Both teachers and students got opportunity to explore new and innovative online resources.
 - Online classroom platforms were found to be effective in giving assignments and sharing of study materials.
 - For the laboratory courses, students got to learn about some of the advanced instruments via simulations.

It places emphasis on how academic departments and programs structure their work, make use of their resources, and collaborate with one another to deliver high-quality education.

An evaluation of the efficacy and efficiency of the administrative procedure is done through the administrative audit process. It comprises evaluation of the various administrative units' policies, plans, and functions. Internal Quality Assurance Centre (IQAC) and Development and Internal Audit Office jointly conduct the internal academic and administrative audit at departments and units once a year. The audit office regularly produces, maintains, and submits academic audit reports in accordance with the guidelines.

OBJECTIVES




